Women and children services

There are **two options** for change. Please read Section 7 of the document
In the proposals for Women and Children Services, **BOTH OPTIONS** will...

Continue to provide Consultant-led obstetric services in Bronglais, Glangwili and Withybush hospitals.

Provide effective antenatal care, including regular screening to check that pregnancies are progressing safely and as planned, to ensure that babies are delivered in the safest location.

Ensure that babies with very high needs receive care at the Level 3 (Intensive Care) Neonatal Unit at Singleton Hospital in Swansea.

Provide paediatric in-patient and outpatient services, community and school nursing services in all three counties.

Hywel Dda Health Board proposes to develop a Paediatric High Dependency Unit and a Level 2 Neonatal Unit (a unit that offers specialist care to sick babies) to provide a comprehensive higher level sick children's service for the first time within the Health Board.

For pregnancies where a risk has been identified for either mother or baby, we are proposing that care will be consultant-led in a new Complex Obstetric Unit, which would be co-located with the Level 2 neonatal Unit.

There are two options for this - either Glangwili Hospital or Withybush Hospital.
Hywel Dda Health Board is proposing **GLANGWILI HOSPITAL**.

There is a possibility that we may not be able to recruit sufficient Doctors to the service even if one of the above options was adopted. This would affect our ability to deliver inpatient paediatric services across the three sites.

If this was the case, we might need to consider an alternative option where inpatient paediatric services are delivered on two sites only - Bronglais Hospital in the north and either Glangwili Hospital or Withybush Hospital in the south. **This option would be a very last resort** if emergency transport solutions were in place and our clinicians were satisfied it was safe to implement.

In such circumstances, Hywel Dda Health Board would propose **GLANGWILI HOSPITAL**.

Emergency care. There are two options for change. Please read Section 7 of the document.

In the proposals for Emergency Care, BOTH OPTIONS will...

Provide surgical services delivered by consultants working in all three Counties.

Provide fast access to specialist doctors and diagnostic tests - for many this can be delivered in an out-patient / assessment environment (leading to a reduction in inpatient beds over time).

Transform the way emergency medical services are delivered and ensure the most up-to-date interventions are adopted for the treatment of common medical emergencies - for example Primary Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (modern heart attack treatment) as currently delivered in the specialist centre in Swansea.

Ensure all major trauma cases are stabilised and transferred to trauma centres in Swansea or Cardiff (as now).

Ensure complex cases are treated in specialist unit(s) where the relevant backup services are readily available.

**Hywel Dda Health Board is proposing OPTION B below.
This would be subject to the successful recruitment and retention of consultants.**

Option A.

Emergency services would be centralised at Glangwili Hospital (Carmarthen).

More limited emergency services would be provided at Bronglais Hospital (Aberystwyth) and Withybush Hospital (Haverfordwest) with more serious emergencies transferred to Glangwili Hospital using a 24-hour paramedic transfer service by ambulance or helicopter.

Prince Philip Hospital (Llanelli) will no longer have an emergency medical admission unit but will provide a nurse-led Local Accident Centre for minor accidents.

Option B. This is the Hywel Dda Health Board proposal.

NO CHANGE to the existing emergency services provided at Bronglais Hospital (Aberystwyth), Glangwili Hospital (Carmarthen) and Withybush Hospital (Haverfordwest).

Addition of Clinical Decisions Units at Bronglais Hospital and Glangwili Hospital once construction work has been completed.

Prince Philip Hospital (Llanelli) will have an emergency medical admission unit and will also provide a nurse-led Local Accident Centre for minor accidents.

Hywel Dda Health Board recognises that the names of some departments providing Emergency Care might need to change in order to clarify the services available.

The naming of some services is being reviewed at an all-Wales level, so Hywel Dda Health Board will need to take into account the national research to make sure that local names are compatible with national standards and other Health Boards across Wales.
